1. Background

The National Day Awards honour individuals who have made significant contributions towards Singapore. This year, 80 NUSS members were recognised. Among them are Professor Tan, and NUSS Past President, Ambassador Gopinath Pillai, who were awarded the Distinguished Service Order and Justice Phang, who was awarded the Meritorious Service Medal. Sadly, Ambassador Pillai is unable to be with us tonight due to his health condition.

NUSS is privileged to have so many accomplished individuals among our members. I hope that your contributions will serve as an inspiration for the rest of us to do more to give back to the community.

2. Programmes and Initiatives

I would like to take this opportunity to share some of NUSS's initiatives that support NUS, our alma mater, and the wider community.

• NUSS-NUS Mentorship Programme

The NUSS-NUS Mentorship Programme is a partnership between NUSS and NUS that started in 2012. The programme connects NUS undergraduates seeking career advice and guidance, with the rich experience of our NUSS members. This year, we have matched 153 Mentors with 250 Mentees.

• NUS Alumni Bursary Fund

In 2013, NUSS pledged to donate up to \$250,000 a year to NUS to fund bursaries for needy students. This pledge seed funded the NUS Alumni Bursary Fund, or ABF, campaign. With the support of other alumni groups, the ABF campaign has a total endowment of \$29 million.

This year, NUSS raised \$705,000 for a charity golf event for the ABF Campaign. This is the highest amount we have raised since 2011 and This amount will go towards a newly launched NUSS Bursary.

• Giving back to the underprivileged

NUSS also seeks to reach out to underprivileged Singaporeans outside of NUS.

In conjunction with the recent annual NUS Cares initiative, many of our members and guests volunteered to organise activities and spent quality time with our two adopted charities – Children's Wishing Well and Dover Park Hospice.

Not only do such efforts help develop a society of caring graduates, they serve as a constant reminder for us to build an inclusive society.

• Intellectual dialogues

The Society regularly welcomes esteemed speakers, both local and overseas, to share their insights at lectures dialogue sessions. The sessions help keep members engaged on the latest trends and issues that matter most to them. Our speakers include Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong and former Prime Ministers Lee Kuan Yee and Goh Chok Tong. We were even privileged to have former President of Afghanistan, Mr. Ashraf Ghani, speak at NUSS.

At a fireside chat earlier this year, NUS President Professor Tan Eng Chye shared with us on the future of learning. We look forward to the next instalment on 9 November where he will speak lifelong learning among graduates.
