NUSS played an active role in supporting this fund and has pledged annual contributions to grow this fund.

The NUSS Lecture Series has become a milestone event for us to discuss critical social, economic and political issues. As a graduate society we too face many challenges as we strive to stay relevant within the broader community. I am hopeful and confident that the next 60 years holds great promise for NUSS and Singapore.
