NUSS HONORARY MEMBER – PROFESSOR TOMMY KOH

Citation for Professor Tommy Koh

Prof Tommy Koh is a man of many talents and achievements — diplomat extraordinary, recipient of the Great Negotiator Award by Harvard University, UN Chair for the Conference on the Law of the Sea, and champion of the downtrodden. Today, I am so honoured to read this citation for Prof Koh, and I honestly do not know where to start.

I will follow Prof's approach in most of his speeches — to cover only two aspects of his distinguished achievements: one, his journey with us at NUSS; and two, his lesser-known contributions that have had a significant impact on the world and humanity.

Prof was one of the pioneering members of our NUSS Advisory Panel, which was established in 2008. He has served NUSS for the past 17 years, giving his time and advice to promote NUSS as a pillar of support for NUS, Singapore, and our community. During my term as President, Prof was the Patron of the Paint-a-Portrait Project of our Past Presidents. It was with his guidance that the project received a grant from the National Heritage Board. Prof moderated our NUSS 60th Anniversary Lecture in 2014, and we had a fireside chat, Conversations with Prof Tommy Koh, in 2013. He also contributed frequently to the NUSS publication, The Commentary, sharing his thoughts on various issues of the day.

On his distinguished achievements on the world stage and his contributions to Singapore — as our Ambassador to the UN and now Ambassador-at-Large — many of us will remember his leadership in the UN Conference on the Law of the Sea, his role in the International Court of Justice on Pedra Branca, the Earth Summit, and his service as Chairman of the National Arts Council and the National Heritage Board, Dean of the NUS Law Faculty, Founding Rector of Tembusu College, and many more. The list goes on.

Let me now share with you one of his lesser-known but significant contributions to the world. Recently, I was touring the Baltic countries — Estonia, Latvia, and Lithuania — and discovered

that 30 years ago, Prof led a team of UN staff to visit these countries to successfully negotiate an agreement with Russia for the withdrawal of Russian troops from their territories after the collapse of the Soviet Union in 1991. The Baltics were formerly part of the Soviet Union, and with its breakup, these small countries achieved independence. Today, they are modern, democratic, and thriving nations. Prof has recently written a book about this journey of peace to the Baltics, which is available at the National Library. Singapore may be a small nation, but we have a giant of a man who persuaded Russia to withdraw its troops peacefully. Amazing.

Lastly, allow me to share a personal story. A few months ago, a family friend asked me to assist his son, who was between jobs. He is a First-Class Honours graduate from NUS and a PhD scholar from the UK. He was keen to continue his academic career and research. I emailed Prof to seek his help through his network, even though he did not know the young man personally. Despite his very busy schedule, Prof took the effort to write to a few of his associates to assist. I was deeply touched — this shows the true human spirit of Prof, who is always ready to help those who have fallen through the cracks.

In recognition of his outstanding service to the world and Singapore, and to NUS and NUSS, we are deeply honoured to confer upon Professor Tommy Koh our Society's highest award — the Honorary Membership of NUSS.

As a founding member of the NUSS Advisory Panel since 2008, Gerard Ee has guided our Society with wisdom and discernment. For 17 years, his voice has been one of quiet strength—shaping our values of stewardship, compassion, and service.

For his lifelong dedication and service, he was conferred the Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award in 2018 and awarded an Honorary Doctor of Letters by NUS in 2017.

In The Graduate, our Society's newsletter, Gerard Ee spoke of compassion, stewardship, and giving back—principles that continue to inspire us all.
